THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

BAPTISM OF THE LORD THE INCARNATION DEMONSTRATES GOD'S complete and total love for humankind. By becoming one of us, Jesus demonstrates the humility necessary to be of service to all of humanity. He is the embodiment of the Servant of whom Isaiah sings in the first reading, someone who sacrifices himself for the sake of others in order to be a "covenant to the people". Jesus Baptism is just one example of this. When Jesus approaches John, John objects, because he is aware of his own subordinate status relative to Jesus. Moreover, John's baptism is for the forgiveness of sins, but since he is sinless, Jesus has no need of such a baptism. He submits, however, to provide an example of his willingness to give up his own position of importance, as well as to emphasize the means by which we are cleansed of sin. His submission is affirmed by the descent of the Holy Spirit, and by the message of the heavenly voice: "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." Every time we participate in the Eucharist we celebrate Jesus' life, reminding ourselves of what he has done for us through his baptism, his earthly ministry, his death, and his resurrection. We also receive spiritual nourishment through his body and blood, so that we are able to imitate him and be "a light to the nations".
