Jubilee Year of Mercy – January 17 – Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mary, whom Catholic traditions names "Mother of Mercy," at Cana intercedes with her Son to show mercy toward the bridal couple: "Son, they have no wine." But he does more! Jesus' transformation of water into wine is a "sign" (John's terms for "miracle") that God's marriage with the whole human race has begun in Jesus' person and ministry, a marriage that will be consummated on the cross: "It is finished" –we are saved! But before Jesus acts, Mary instructs the servers to *prepare the way* for Jesus' miracle of mercy: "Do whatever he tells you." During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Mother Church, like Mother Mary, instructs us to share the Spirit's manifold gifts—some of which Paul lists in today's second reading—in generous service to the human family. Thus we *prepare the way* for Jesus' new miracles of mercy, transforming life's sometimes stagnant water into the refreshing wine of God's mercy. *Peter Scagnelli, Copyright J.S. Paluch Co., Inc.*

JANUARY 23 - FEAST OF ST. MARIANNE COPE, O.S.F.

St. Marianne Cope, O.S.F., the Mother of Outcastes, was a Franciscan religious in New York State. A leader in health education, she founded St. Joseph's Hospital in Syracuse which continues as an excellent Catholic hospital to this day. In response to a call to serve outcastes afflicted with Hansen's disease (leprosy), she led a group of Franciscans to the Sandwich Islands in the Pacific. She labored for thirty-five years, like St. Damien, at Kalaupapa, Molokai. She was canonized a Saint at Rome on the same day as St. Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized -- October 21, 2012.

Let us pray to St. Marianne Cope for all our parishioners who are suffering -- at home, in hospitals, in nursing homes.

Lord, through the intercession of St. Marianne Cope who showed compassion for all who are seriously ill, we beg your care for those who suffer -- especially John Bigtree, Allan Gorrow, Beatrice Cole, Eddie Terrance, Julia David, Clyde Cree, Francis Cree, Larry Pyke, Cecilia Cook, Marjorie Lazore, Laurie Connors, Debbie Bero, Beverly Garrow, Sheila Ransom, Sandra Terrance, Leo Delormier, Marjorie Thompson, Norris Thompson and Mary Ella Jackson.
