### Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

**January 18<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup>, 2015 – Why This Week?**

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is an international Christian ecumenical observance kept annually between 18 January and 25 January. It is actually an octave, that is, an observance lasting eight days. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. By annually observing the WPCU, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (cf. *John 17:21*).

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, or this eight day period was first proposed by the Franciscan Fr. Paul Wattson in 1908 and begins with the feast of the confession of St. Peter and ends with the feast of the conversion of St. Paul.

By finding ways to pray together during this week, we join with all people around the world who are praying, reflecting, studying, and even eating and drinking together to celebrate and pray for Christian unity. We pray to find ways to express the degree of communion already given to the churches, and to pray together that we may be more fully united one with another, and all of us with Christ. But talking about unity among churches will begin by talking of unity among us within the Catholic Church, in our Catholic community, in our Catholic families.

### Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

THE CHURCH IS called to evangelize, to grow disciples. These days there are many books and programs detailing the how and why of evangelization. Today's Gospel, however, details the essential starting points of genuine evangelization. Evangelization begins with the encounter. John and his disciples encounter Jesus as he walks in the countryside. John shares with Andrew and the other disciple what he has come to believe, that Jesus is the Anointed One. Andrew and his friend are open to knowing more about Jesus, so they begin to follow him. Jesus makes himself available to them by asking them, "What are you looking for?" The disciples respond by asking a question of their own, which results in an invitation to "come and see," to a deeper relationship. We know that this encounter and invitation were the beginning of a life-long relationship that changed the course of history. Participation in the New Evangelization, which flows from our encounter and relationship with Jesus, begins with our very human care and concern for each other. These simple actions can be the grounding through which others share with us what they seek and we in turn share the Good News of Jesus' saving action. *Connie Paré, London, ON.
