Week of Christian Unity

In the bulletin of last week, we announced that this week is the week for Christian unity (18th to 25th January). We recall the words of the Lord: "Father, the hour has come...I pray for all who believe in me that ALL MAY BE ONE". It is important to know that Jesus made this passionate prayer when "the hour has come". The hour refers to his passion; his death and resurrection, meaning that Jesus' prayer about unity was his last testament. When we talk of Christian unity, we do not mean only the co-operation between Churches. We begin with unity among ourselves; all of us belonging to one Church, to one community, to one parish, to one mission, to one neighborhood to one family. And this unity begins with me, my acceptance of the other as myself. The water of baptism has become thick, even thicker, than the blood of natural relationship. And as St. Paul would say later in his letter to the Galatians, "In Christ there is no more Jew or Gentile, slave or freeman, male or female. All are one in Christ Jesus" (Gal. 3:28) For personal meditations, read John chapter 17 and Galatians chapter 3.

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: John the Baptist is the classic image of the Old Testament prophet. He comes out of the desert, he dresses in animal skins, he warns of death and destruction, he experiences visions. Early in the Gospel of John we meet this herald of the good news of salvation. He is completely dedicated to his life's purpose, which is to point everyone towards Jesus Christ. His message is clear and unmistakable: The man right here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. John does more than just point out that Jesus is the Son of God. He encourages his own disciples to become followers of Jesus and he dies for this truth. We can receive this Gospel as a history lesson or the account of a complex and fascinating character. At its heart, however, this scripture continues the mission of John the Baptist, pointing us to Christ today and calling us to recognize and follow him as the Lamb of God.

Through our baptism and our continuing life of faith, we are all called and equipped to bear witness to the mercy and grace of God in Jesus Christ, in the places and conditions of our daily lives. That is our privilege as the followers of Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God. We are the heralds of the good news for today.

Quote from Pope Francis in his address to the International Federation of Medical Associations:
"Every Child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ. Your being Catholic entails a greater responsibility to contemporary culture, by contributing to recognizing the transcendent dimension of human life, the imprint of God's creative work, from the first moment of conception. This is a task of the new evangelization that often requires going against the tide and paying for it personally. The Lord is counting on you to spread the Gospel of Life"

America will remember the 41st anniversary of the tragic Roe vs. Wade Decision of the Supreme Court, which legalized abortion in this country. In prayerful recognition, "Nine Days of Prayer, Penance and Pilgrimage" will take place in the United States from January 18th - 26th. You are asked in a special way by Pope Francis and all the Bishops of the U.S. to pray for a greater respect for human life during these nine days.
