LENT

Lent is the season of forty weekdays between Ash Wednesday, February 10, and Holy Saturday, March 26, when Christians focus on simple living, prayer, and fasting in order to grow closer to God. Jesus went into the desert to pray and to fast before He went forth to proclaim the kingdom of God and to suffer crucifixion for our redemption. Christians spend forty days to pray and fast so they can focus on what really matters in life.

Some go through life without purpose, direction, passion. It is easy to run around in circles, as we get caught up in work, family, relationships, sports. When there is no time for quiet and rest, there is an inner emptiness. Some try to fill that emptiness with mindless TV, Facebook, Smartphones, or stimulants like alcohol and cigarettes. They run away from life and from God. We run away from life and from God.

Lent is a time to "repent and renew." Lent helps us to re-focus our life on what really matters. Lent is a 40- day trial run in changing our lifestyle and letting God change our heart.

Here are a few suggestions for this Lent.

RECONCILIATION: In this Year of Divine Mercy, let us be sorry for our sins and make a good confession. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we will experience God's infinite love and forgiveness.

FASTING: We might fast from things that distract us from God. We might give up some favorite foods and donate to the Food Pantry for the Poor. Skip a meal a day and use that time for prayer or service to others. Instead of being a couch-potato before TV, go for a walk and enjoy the beauties of God's Creation. Praise and thank Him!

SERVICE: Serving others is to serve Jesus. Lent is a good season to take on the Spiritual and Corporal works of Mercy. Give food and clothing to the needy. Volunteer to help an elderly neighbor. Go to visit the lonely in a nursing home. Make a daily phone call to someone who lives alone.

PRAYER: Pray always, while walking, waiting for an appointment, before and after meals, before going to bed.

Most of all, pray at Holy Mass daily during Lent. The Holy Mass, the sacrifice of Calvary renewed, is the highest form of worship. In the Holy Mass, it is Jesus Christ, God as well as Man, who is our Intercessor, our Priest, our Victim. His prayers, His merits, and His offerings are infinite in value. One Mass gives God more praise and thanksgiving, makes more atonement for sin, and pleads more eloquently than all other prayers.

Sacrifice an hour on Sundays or even on other days to offer the perfect prayer - Holy Mass.

Jubilee Year of Mercy – February 7 – Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis calls us to share with everyone the tender compassion of God that we ourselves have experienced. In today's Gospel, Luke uses a special Greek word conveying just such tenderness. In the other Gospels, Jesus calls the disciples to be "fishers," *haleis*, the same word that means catching fish with hooks or nets, to be killed and eaten. But Luke uses *zogron*, from *zoe* or "life," meaning "catch or gather people alive," as animal lovers capture without harming, rescue from "the wild" for a better life, and protect in aquarium or zoo, tenderly cared for by professionals committed to the creatures' well-being. So in Luke's vision – and Pope Francis' as well – we who have been "caught alive" by God's mercy ourselves are to become "missionaries of mercy" during this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, rescuing fellow sinners from danger and gathering them into Jesus' community to enjoy fullness of life.
