## This Sundays Reflection

**MAN DOES NOT LIVE BY BREAD ALONE.** In today's first reading, we are told the story of Jacob and his family, who went to Egypt during a famine. Later on, his descendants were perceived to be a threat and were enslaved. Later still, they continually recall and give thanks for their deliverance from this slavery. They remember that they were led by the Lord through the wilderness, to the promised land. They became to the People of God in the wilderness. They remember, too, how they were tested and how they tested God. Sometimes, they were unfaithful. They struggled to be the people they had promised to be. There were times of closeness to God, but there were many times of temptation and sin.

Jesus knew his people's history well enough not to repeat it. He, too, was tested in the wilderness. His temptations mirrored Israel's. They complained that they had no bread; Jesus was tempted to focus solely on his physical hunger. He chose, instead, to make God's Word his priority. Israel made a golden calf and worshipped it; Jesus chose to worship God alone. Israel continually tried and tested God; Jesus would not put the Lord to the test. Lent calls us to remember and learn from the history of salvation, to turn away from past sins, and to choose again to follow Jesus.

**A REFLECTION FOR LENT.** On Ash Wednesday we received ashes on our foreheads, acknowledging our frail humanity and sinfulness. We are mortal and will one day die. We have offended GOD and those who share our lives. But what moves us and walk up the aisle to receive ashes is not despair. We believe that the Son of God loves us, has shared all that we are, except our sinfulness, and gives us hope.

Each year, our Church calls to us to the three great actions of Lent. **PRAY** – acknowledge that GOD is the center of our lives. **FAST** - Trust that with GOD'S help, we can work to control the disorders of mind and body that pull us away from him. **HELP OTHERS** – Show that we are members of a living body, the Body of Christ, in which each part supports the others. Ashes are not just a sign that we are mortal and sinful, but witness to what we can become through Jesus Christ who transformed the ashes of Good Friday into the new life of Easter Sunday.
