<p>It is to the providential and caring love of God for Israel that Jesus appeals today in continuation of His Sermon on the Mount when he tells his disciples that they should not worry over what to eat, wear or drink. If God cares for the birds of the sky and grass in the field, how much more would He look after us, His chosen people who are created in His own image and likeness? Jesus here touches on a very real and existential point. Down deep we are an anxious and worried people. We are defeated by our weaknesses, brought low because of our mistakes, and even are harmed by things out of our control. The more we worry and are anxious, the more we tend to ignore, neglect or even deny God. This Gospel is wrong, God does not seem to be caring for me, many of us will say. And we can point to many people who have trusted in God and lost everything: jobs, friends, wealth and even life as well. To this extent, Jesus' approach to life and its many worries seems simplistic. Jesus knew humanity better than anyone ever has to have realized that simply telling someone not to worry does not end the worrying. Jesus is not forbidding us from working hard, planning and saving for our future, or even having legitimate concerns about life's demands. We obviously need to care for the needs of those around us, be conscientious in carrying out our responsibilities, or even save for our future needs. Jesus is commanding us to cease from being "concerned" in a way that is sinful— to cease from worry or anxiety. He calls upon us to keep on trusting in a God, who is benevolent and generous towards everyone. Only God can give us meaning; only God can save us from the awful mess we sometimes find ourselves in.</p>

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

Jesus does not seem to be a person who worried a great deal. He lived his life on the principle of trusting his heavenly Father, and he tried to teach his followers to do the same. Jesus does not deny the reality of human needs, but forbids making them the object of anxious care and, in effect, becoming their slave. Disciples may have legitimate concerns for material goods, but if those concerns are filled with insecurities and fears, and cause new forms of enslavement to wealth, they will inevitably lead people into slavery to two separate masters. At the heart of all our concerns must be the powerful reality of the kingdom of God. In that new reality, there is no storing up of things, but sharing in such a way that all have what is necessary to live. The Kingdom is the new life together, in which each person feels responsible for others. This way of seeing the kingdom helps us to understand better the parables of the birds and the flowers, because for Jesus, Divine Providence passes through this new way of being and acting. All of our trials and tribulations, our pains, frustrations and anxieties are not in vain. The next time we get that fearful feeling that our life is for the birds, let us take heart, and have a bit more courage and confidence in the Father's care.

LENT 2014

March 5th, 2014 is Ash Wednesday: which marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. Two masses on **Ash Wed: 7.30 am and 5:00pm Stations of the Cross: 3.30 pm** on **Saturdays and 9.30 am on Sundays.**

Abstinence: All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday are bound to abstain totally from meat on the following days: **Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent & Good Friday.**

Fasting: All Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are bound also to serve the Law of fast on the following days: Ash Wednesday (March 5th) and Good Friday (April 18th). Fasting, that is eating less, involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Lighter nourishment may be taken on two other occasions in the course of the day.

Seminars: On Fridays of Lent (14th March, 21st March, 28th March, and April 11th), we shall have seminars open to all at the Kateri Hall. These seminars are teaching sessions on Lent, Liturgical Seasons, Liturgical celebrations and few other related issues about our faith, organized by the Faith Ministry. Please try to be there. The time is 6-8pm.
