The 4 P.M. Mass next Saturday, March 19th, opens HOLY WEEK with the Palm Sunday Liturgy. We will hear again the story of the Passion of Jesus.

Will the Passion have any effect on my heart? Will I just be there to wave blessed palms in the crowd proclaiming, "Hosannah to the Son of David!" only to join again on Good Friday to cry, "Crucify Him!"

Will I be a Judas, betraying my best Friend for thirty pieces of silver?

Will I be a Peter, denying that I even know that Man?

Will I be a Pontius Pilate, washing my hands free: "I am innocent of the Blood of this Just Man!"

Will I be with the Mother of Jesus, as she walks with her Son the painful journey to Calvary?

Will I be a Simon of Cyrene, helping Jesus to carry His cross?

Will I be a Veronica wiping the His bloody Face in consolation?

In this year of Mercy, Holy Week must mean for me a leap in FAITH in Jesus, the Son of God, who loves me unto death. For this one week, can I journey with Him in prayer, in sacrifice, in celebrating the daily Liturgies, in walking the Way of the Cross with suffering humanity?

If I can truly LIVE Holy Week, I will come to realize on Good Friday with the Centurion who pierced the side of Jesus with a sword, "Truly, this Man was the Son of God!"

Will I have enough faith, enough love, to be able to set aside all the "stuff" that takes up my daily life and give priority to the One most important for my salvation? Plan ahead!

Jubilee Year of Mercy - March 13 - Fifth Sunday of Lent

How fitting that the first Sunday Angelus of Pope Francis, who has made mercy his papacy's theme, took place the last time today's Gospel about Jesus' encounter with the adulterous woman was proclaimed. "Jesus' attitude is striking," Francis declared. "We do not hear words of scorn or condemnation, only words of love, of mercy, an invitation to conversion: 'Neither do I condemn you' " (John 8:11). Francis continued: "God's face is the face of a merciful father who is always patient. Have you thought about God's patience [God] has with each one of us? That is [God's] mercy. [God] always has patience, patience with us ... understands us ... waits for us ... does not tire of forgiving us" if we return 'with a contrite heart' (Pope Francis, Angelus address, March 17, 2013). Parishes preparing catechumens may proclaim Jesus' raising of Lazarus. Referring to Lazarus, and all those "raised" from the "death" of sin, Jesus defines the community's "mission of mercy" - "Untie him and let him go" (John 11:44). *Peter Scagnelli, Copyright J.S.
