THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM

HOLY THURSDAY: Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Maundy Thursday is the other name which comes from the Latin word "mandatum" (command), referring to the episode of the washing of feet of the disciples, a moving act of love and humility; that they shall wash each other's feet as servant leaders; that they shall love each other as Jesus loved them, so the world will know that they are His disciples. (ref. Jn 13). The disciples will DO THIS in memory of Him.

GOOD FRIDAY: Celebration of the Lord's Passion.

This commemoration of the passion and death of the Lord was the passage/way to His glory and exaltation; truly a GOOD day for us because it brought us redemption and liberation and revealed the goodness of God towards us; it is a HOLY day because in the death of Jesus, God destroyed sin and made us HOLY. At the same time it is a day of mourning and lamentation because Jesus, the Son of man and the Son of God, was crucified.

I VENERATE THE CROSS as an expresses of my sorrow, repentance, and love for my Savior who died for me.

HOLY SATURDAY: THE EASTER VIGIL.

The night of nights, in which we celebrate the resurrection of Christ. The Light has overcome darkness. Indeed, CHRIST OUR LIGHT! He is more powerful than death.
