Christ has Risen! Alleluia! He is Alive!
This is the greatest news; after forty days of Lent, of prayers, and all kinds of love and charity, we rejoice. He conquered sin and death, bringing a sense to our sufferings and hope for those who died believing in Him. May the Risen Lord bring you peace, healing, hope and lot's of joy during the Easter Season! **Happy Easter!**

THE GOSPEL OF THE RESURRECTION must be proclaimed to all so everyone might encounter Christ, the Risen One, present and working in history. "Christ is risen!" And, in him, through baptism, we too are risen and have passed from death to life, from slavery of sin to the freedom of love. This is the good news that we are called to take to others and to every place. Faith in Jesus' resurrection and the hope that he brought us are the most beautiful gifts that the Christian can and must give to others. To all and to each, therefore, let us not tire of saying: Christ is risen! Let us proclaim it with words, but above all with the witness of our lives. The good news of the resurrection should shine on our faces, in our feelings and attitude, in the way we treat others. We proclaim Christ's resurrection when his light illuminates the dark moments of our life and we can share that with others: when we know how to smile with those who smile and weep with those who weep; when we walk beside those who are sad and in danger of losing hope; when we recount our experience of faith with those who are searching for meaning and for happiness. With our attitude, with our witness, with our life, we say: Jesus is risen!

Jesus, help me share the good news of Jesus' resurrection with everyone in my life today.

FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION

Today we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In the readings we learn how the disciples of Jesus didn't understand at first what was happening. Perhaps, like the disciples, we may at times have doubts or questions about our faith or the gospel message of Jesus. If you have doubts or questions, address them. Don't ignore them. We can have questions, and be seeking answers, and still have hope in God's promise of eternal life in heaven. The message of Easter is one of new life. It is one of hope in something far greater that we can imagine. God welcomes our questions and wants us to seek understanding and, through that, a deeper relationship with him.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

On April 3rd, we will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Sister Faustina wrote in her diary: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon these souls who approach the fount of my Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me even though its sins be as scarlet.

Jubilee Year of Mercy – March 27 – Resurrection of the Lord: Easter Sunday

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. Alleluia! Easter is always, but especially in this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, the victory of God's gentle but invincible mercy raising up Jesus, 'faithful witness, the first-born of the dead' (Revelation 1:5, "first-born among many brothers [and sisters]" (Romans 8:29), conquering death in all its forms, in all of us in the human family. In Luke's Vigil Gospel, heavenly messengers send the woman forth: "Remember what [Jesus] said to you" (Luke 24:6). In John's Gospel, the empty tomb likewise "sends forth" Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the Beloved Disciple, who believe though they do not fully understand. Finally, Luke's evening "Emmaus" Gospel sends us forth, as "missionaries of mercy," assuring us that we will encounter the Risen Lord, today and every day, in "the stranger" we meet along life's journey, in "the Word that makes our hearts burn within us," and "in the breaking of bread" (see Luke 24:32, 35).
