	<p><b>Reading the passion of Jesus</b>, we meet many characters: Pilate, the Apostles, especially Peter, and Judas, the robbers, the Jewish authorities, Barabbas who was freed, the Roman soldier who recognized Jesus as the Son of God; the holy women, Joseph of Arimathea, etc. Each played his role as much as the life and the meaning of what Jesus stood for touched him or her. The Passion drama is not a once upon a time event that happened just only once. It also plays itself out among us today. It plays out everywhere there is pain and evil, everywhere truth is sacrificed for personal gains and to political calculus, everywhere justice is turned upside down, everywhere the innocent is accused and condemned, truth murdered. What role do we play today? Commitment or indifference? John Stuart Kennedy compared our modern reaction to those of the characters around Jesus in his passion in a poem titled: <i>Jesus in Birmingham</i>.          "When Jesus came to Golgotha, they nailed him to a tree          They crowned him with a Crown of thorns, Red were his wounds and deep          For those were crude and cruel days; and human flesh was cheap          When Jesus came to Birmingham, they only passed him by          They would not touch a hair of him; they only let him die          For men have grown tenderer, they would not give him pain          They only passed down in the street and left him in the rain          And so it rained, the winter rain that drenched him through and through          And when the entire crowd has left the street without a soul to see          Then Jesus crashed against the wall, cried out in a loud voice and sighed:          Oh poor Calvary was more enduring, than the indifference of modern man".</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Fr. **World Day of Youth**

TODAY'S READINGS ENCOURAGE US to reflect on our gifts and how we use them for others and for the glory of God. Each of us could nod in agreement when Isaiah acknowledges: "The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher". God has blessed each of us this way, Isaiah continues, so that we "may know how to sustain the weary with a word." Our gifts are to be shared and life giving.

Don't hold back and bite your tongue. Use it to speak the word of God. Use it to confess that Jesus is Lord! Use it as God does, to bless and create a way to continue God's life among us and within us. Let us use our well-trained voices for the benefit of our neighbor and for the glory of God.
