Body and Blood of Christ

WHEN I WAS a child in rural Quebec, our parish celebrated Corpus Christi with a procession. Parish organizations and others sent units to march: the Knights of Columbus, Catholic Women's League and altar servers, along with the fire department, Boy Scouts, Girl Guides and sundry organizations – small towns love a parade. One year I was faced with a conflict. I was both an altar server and a Scout, and both organizations expected me to march with them. Parts of me wanted to march with each but I was conflicted, divided within myself. What has this got to do with the lesson from this feast? The feast we commemorate today, the Body and Blood of Christ, was intended to unite, not divide. When Jesus broke the bread and offered the cup, "all of them drank from it" as a covenant, a bond that united all of his followers with each other and with him for all eternity. Too often, however, we let the Eucharist divide us; we let the scandal of division separate us from the very gift of unity Jesus gave us to bind us to him and to each other. I can't remember who I marched with, but in the end it isn't important. What is important for us Christians is that we remain united with Jesus and with each other.
