The Most Holy Trinity

Experts in religion tell us that people always try to be like the god they worship. People who worship a warrior god tend to be warmongering, people who worship a god of pleasure tend to be pleasure seeking, people who worship a god of wrath tend to be vengeful, and people who worship a god of love tend to be loving. What does the doctrine of the Blessed Trinity tell us about the kind of God we worship; and what does this say about the kind of people we should be? God does not exist in solitary individualism but in a community of love and sharing. True love requires partnership. We are made in God's image and likeness. The self needs to be in a horizontal relationship with others and in a vertical relationship with God. In that way our life becomes Trinitarian. The doctrine of the Blessed Trinity, therefore, challenges us to adopt rather an I-and-God-and-neighbor principle; in place of the "I" and "Mine" principle of unbridled individualism, the credo of our age. We do not belong to ourselves or exist for ourselves. I am a Christian insofar as I live in a relationship of love with God and other people. The other person, my life spouse, my colleague, my neighbor, my brother or my sister is not an enemy and a rival, whose existence and wellbeing deprives me of my own welfare; as our world always makes us to believe. The other is not a hindrance to what I am or what I am called to be. We discover our true identity, not in the individualistic struggle each against the other, but in solidarity with each other and in being there for each other. And in that way we realize our Trinitarian calling. So wherever and whenever human beings succeed in building a fellowship, wherever mutual and friendly relationship exists among humans - in the family, in the church community or in the society - there is the Trinity realized.
