SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI
(THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST)

As we celebrate this feast of Corpus Christi, let us meditate on the supreme gift that Jesus, Son of God, instituted at the Last Supper so that He could remain with us. *The Divine Office* reminds us today:

Know that in this bread is the Body of Christ which hung upon the cross and in this cup is the Blood of Christ which flowed from His side. Take, therefore, and eat His Body; take and drink His Blood, and you will become members of His Body. Eat this sacred food so that your bond of unity with Christ may never be broken. Drink this sacred blood, the price He paid for you so that you will never lose heart because of your sinfulness .

Let us try to study Sacred Scripture this week and try to grow in adoration, reverence, and love for the Blessed Sacrament. The Letter of St. Paul to Corinthians will help as we examine our attitude toward Mass and the Eucharist. Do we keep holy the Lord's Day by coming to Mass each Sunday? Are we attentive, reverent and silent in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament or do we distract others who are trying to pray? Do we appreciate the Sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and renewed on the altar by offering the whole Mass with the priest? Or do we come late and leave early like Judas who left the Last Supper early and went out to betray Jesus? If we have not been practicing our faith for some time and are aware of serious (mortal) not confessed, do we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation first before receiving the Body and Blood of Christ? Do we make Sunday Mass a priority for our family, no matter what other events are on our weekly schedule? The family that prays together stays together.

I HEARD AN expert on poetry remark recently that poetry is language that mirrors the soul. Jesus must have understood this, for he almost always turned to the language of poetry to convey to his listeners what was most important for them to understand: he is the gate of the sheepfold; he is the source of living water; he is the vine and they the branches – and in today's gospel, he says that to follow him it is essential to eat his body and drink his blood. Jesus longs to convey to us just how profoundly we must remain in his love if we are going to understand his ministry and find strength to live out joyfully our own calling to be God's presence of loving compassion in our broken world. In the Eucharist we are invited to grasp the depth of the love of God for us and for our world, and to unite our own joy and pain with those of Christ. Usually we receive the Eucharist with others. The Eucharist is a call to community. Together we draw strength and offer thanks, trusting in the wisdom of Pope Francis who has reminded us that the Eucharist is not "a prize for the perfect but... nourishment for the weak." (*Evangelii Gaudium, 47*)
