SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES - JUNE 29

Simon Peter, son of John was a fisherman of Bethsaida, Galilee, chosen by Jesus to be an apostle. Although favored as a witness of the Transfiguration, Peter sometimes displayed his human failings -- impetuosity, weakness, and fear. Although he fell asleep while Jesus endured the bloody agony of Gethsemane, denied three times even knowing Jesus, and feared to be with Jesus on Calvary, Peter later manifested his faith and love. He boldly proclaimed, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!" "Lord, You know all things. You know that I love You." Inflamed by the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost, Peter became the head of Christ's Church, going out to the world to spread the Good News of God's love. When the Romans were crucifying him in 67 A.D., Peter begged to be hung upside down on the cross since he felt unworthy to die in the same manner as Jesus had died.

Saul of Tarsus was a Pharisee on the road to Damascus to persecute the early Christians, when he was knocked off his high horse and blinded. Jesus asked, "Why are you persecuting me?" Once converted, "Paul" became an ardent apostle, who could say, "I live now, not I, but Christ lives in me." St. Paul journeyed throughout the Mediterranean countries to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus and wrote many of the Epistles in the New Testament. Like Peter, he was martyred during the persecution of Emperor Nero.

Jubilee Year of Mercy – June 26 – Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Yet again in Ordinary Time, Jesus seems to demand extraordinary commitment. A would-be-disciple enthusiastically volunteers to follow Jesus "where" (Luke 9:57). Jesus replies that "wherever" means "nowhere to rest his head" (9:58). To other candidates, Jesus brusquely denies reasonable requests to fulfill family obligations (9:59, 61), declaring that discipleship demands total commitment – now! But Jesus also demands that we not judge how others respond. When James and John volunteered to "call down fire from heaven" (9:54) to destroy an unwelcoming town, Jesus "turned and rebuked them" (9:55). All violence of any kind is completely unacceptable among Jesus' disciples, a lesson this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* is teaching the Christian community once again. Paul's challenge to the Galatians and us reinforces Jesus' decisive command to James and John that they express their commitment to him through compassion for others. We must abandon the violence of "biting and devouring one another" (Galatians 5:15), choosing instead to "serve one another through love" (5:13).
