Anthony</p> <p style="text-align: center;">The Many Fruits of the Bishop Noel's Pastoral Visit (Summary)</p> <p>The pastoral visit of Bishop Noel Simard has come and gone and we thank all who contributed to its success. We are happy and are confident that his presence to us on the first day of summer would be a sign of the light and brightness of God that will shine on our pastoral life for the future. In the near future, I believe that we would work closely to appropriate and reap the fruits of the many encouraging words and exhortations he addressed to us; some of the highlights which are as follows: It is interesting that in the two homes, his theme was, as addressed to the elders was: "You are very much important to us as we are to you", the Bishop made it known that is the human experience of suffering and sickness that brings out the best in the human being, which is love and compassion. Take away these realities, you take away the best of the heart of man. He reminds them of the importance of their prayers and the offering of their sickness to the world, especially to us who are still in active service. To the parish councilors and finance council, he stressed the need for commitment, and a correct understanding of the Church as belonging to all of us. Today the realities before us demand from us to "be a Church differently" This means the active involvement of the laity, and the judicious use of our little resources for a great achievement. We should remember the four axes of the Church: teaching, praying / celebration, social work and caring for one another. To the confirmation candidates: "Do not fear. Trust in God, abandon yourself to God, and he will use you". Saints Peter and Paul

Living in Nova Scotia, you learn great respect for rocks. They are from everywhere, in every shape and size. The smallest ones sneak inside your shoe and cause you to hobble along the road, while the largest ones seem to have no beginning or end. We don't the awesome mountain ranges found in other parts of North America, but we do know the ways of our rocks. Though rocks seem solid, impenetrable immovable and unchanging, they actually do change because of the interaction between their geological make-up and the effect of the environment. The stone mason can tell you which stones can be cut for a building foundation; which will make a great seawall; which must be placed very carefully to allow for shifting, cracking and erosion; and which should just be left alone. In today's Gospel we hear Jesus promise to build his church on Peter - the Rock - the one who confesses that Jesus Christ is the Son of the Living God, "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven," Jesus says in response to Peter's assertion of faith. Like the stone mason, Christ forms and shapes Peter to be the foundation for his body, the Church, which is sustained by the Spirit of the Living God to fulfill the mission of bringing the Good News of salvation to our world. Some rock indeed!
