14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

IT CAN BE hard to be a prophet, especially to acquaintances. In today's Gospel, the people of Jesus' hometown reject him. They think they know him. They have pigeonholed Jesus, the son of Mary, as a simple carpenter. When Jesus defies their expectations of him, they become defensive. Like the Israelites of Ezekiel's day, they are stubborn: they refuse to accept God's Word. Although their lack of faith amazes him, Jesus remains faithful to his mission, proclaiming the kingdom of God among the villages. We may not consider ourselves prophets, yet because we have been baptized into the life of Christ, we share in the prophetic role. In a unique way, we are all prophets in the hometown spaces of our daily life. Whenever we are faithful to the Gospel's message, we are prophets to our families, friends, co-workers and communities. We may grow disheartened if family members abandon the Church. We may become discouraged if others reject the message and criticize us. We may stumble and doubt ourselves. This is when the sufficiency of God's grace, so powerful for Paul in his struggles, emboldens us to carry on in fidelity. In this Eucharistic celebration, let us give thanks for the grace, for the life of Christ dwelling within us, that gives us the courage to be hometown prophets. *Louise McEwan, Trail, BC.*
