	<hr style="border-top: 1px dashed black;"/> <p>Jesus invites us in the Gospel of today to have childlike confidence in our God. This confidence Jesus sees in the adult men and women who have left everything to follow Him and that prompted His thanksgiving to the Father in today's Gospel. Midway into His earthly ministry, Jesus could look back and observe how, on the one hand, the wise and learned religious figures of His days (Pharisees and Scribes) could not accept the Good News of the Kingdom; and on the other hand how the little ones (the poor, those without learning, workers of the land and sea) have left everything to devote their time and talents to Him and to His Good News. It is not necessarily learning that has proven an obstacle to the first group. As humans we were born with an intellect and we need to use it. Jesus is not anti-intellectual. He is simply saying that sometimes, selfish and arrogant leaders can use intellectual reasoning and creation of rules as a way of control. Jesus in the Gospels teaches us what we need to know and that is why the words of Jesus, His message about the 'kingdom' is what we need to learn and think about. But over and above learning and knowing, Jesus demands a childlike trust in Him and in His promise that He will be with us along the way. Most importantly, when we have this confidence and trust that Jesus demands, following him will no longer be burdensome; the demands of the Gospel will become for us an easy yoke, a light and pleasant burden, because it is borne out of love and trust in Jesus.</p> <p align="right"><i>Fr. MOUNTAIN CLIMBERS ARE a curious breed. With backpack on and determination in the eyes, the hiker treads up a winding path toward the hill's summit. Once the hiker arrives at the top, the beauty of the vast horizon dissipates any memory of leg pain or rocky slope. With each breath, the immense joy of being alive fills heart and mind. The metaphor of journey is used in many religious traditions. In the Bible, Abraham, Moses and the prophets encounter the divine presence on the mountain. The Christian life, with its many blessings and the challenges, is also a kind of journey. People of all walks find themselves "hiking" paths unknown. Decisions are made, families struggle, the future remains insecure. For many, the Church moves in strange directions, and they want to give up; scandals continue to derail the credibility of the leaders and mission. Where does this path go?
