THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

HE WENT TO HIM AND BANDAGED HIS WOUNDS. The Parables of the Good Samaritan would have been shocking to Jesus' audience: the idea of a 'good' Samaritan was completely foreign to them. The Samaritans were descended from northern Israelites who had intermarried with foreigners some 750 years earlier. As such, Jews considered them to be non-Jews whose religious beliefs had been contaminated by their foreign ancestors. Thus, it is unlikely that any of Jesus' Jewish listeners would have considered a Samaritan to be a 'neighbour.' In fact, in a strict reading of Leviticus 19.18, the command to "love your neighbor as yourself" means "fellow countrymen only." But Jesus makes a Samaritan the hero of this parable in order to change the focus of the lawyer's question, "Who is my neighbour?" Jesus does not define who is or is not a neighbor. Instead, he describes someone who acts like a neighbour and helps without hesitation. At the end of the parable, the lawyer understands that "the one who showed him mercy" was a neighbour to the man who had been robbed. He recognizes that our actions are more important than an abstract definition of "neighbour." Jesus then challenges him – and us – to act the same way: to act like neighbours to those in need. *John L. McLaughlin, Toronto, ON.*
