Meditation

The drama that plays out in the Gospel has two fronts. First Jesus multiplies bread to the people, a miracle pointing to the abundance of his spiritual attention to us in his bid to feed us with the Eucharist; also a sign of the eternal banquet that we shall all partake in his Kingdom as Isaiah invites us in the first reading. Secondly, Jesus also shows another type of miracle that can operate among human beings: the miracle of sharing. Sharing multiplies the good. When the disciples asked Jesus to send the crowd away, Jesus asked them to give them something to eat. The disciples gave excuses: we have only little, and our little is not enough. This reflects our many excuses not to be of help to one another: what we have will not be enough for us, we normally think. Jesus took the little, and after prayers, made the people sit down together, a sharing posture, and behold the miracle. This reminds of a poem in our early days:

When mother has too many guests in the house/ But only few loaves to share/ She cuts the loaves into tiny bits/ And somehow all ends up having enough/ I do not know what a Miracle is/ But gradually it dawns on me/ That when many few in Love share/ Is a Miracle always there!

God's providence is not in baskets lowered from the sky, but through the hands and hearts of those who love Him. Today would have been an opportunity for me to talk about our "food bank"; our little means we have to contribute to the feeding of the less privileged ones. We have around us many who depend on our 'little leftovers', on our readiness to share, on our willingness to open our hearts, so that they can also have something to eat. Jesus says "give them something to eat yourselves".
