Passion of Saint John the Baptist

After John's birth, his father Zechariah spoke to Isaiah's prophecy (Benedictus'), saying that his son John would prepare the way of the Lord. Luke writes that John lived alone in the wilderness until "the word of God came to him," then began to travel around the countryside, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, thus fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah.

In his zeal, John reproved Herod the Tetrarch for, among other things, living with Herodias, his brother's wife; the ruler had him imprisoned. On Herod's birthday, Salome, the daughter of Herodias, danced, and Herod was so impressed he told her to ask for whatever she wanted. She consulted her mother, who told her to ask for the head of John the Baptist on a platter. Herod could not refuse to honor his oath. The news of John's death soon reached his disciples who came for the body and laid it in a tomb.

Sunday Meditation

Peter's lack of comprehension in this Gospel passage should be a source of comfort and encouragement for modern Christians. If Peter, who lived with Jesus daily, could misunderstand Jesus, then surely there is hope for those of us two thousand years later. The problem for Peter was that Jesus was not living up to his expectations. The Jews of his time expected the Messiah to be a worldly military leader who would drive the occupying Romans out of Israel. Instead, Jesus talks about going to Jerusalem to be killed. No wonder Peter tries to talk him out of this crazy notion. Peter was unable to go beyond his contemporaries' views and comprehend the radically different thing God was doing through Jesus. Jesus was going to set them free, just not in the way they expected. We have the benefit of reading this passage in light of the Resurrection, which demonstrated Jesus' power over death itself. We know today, in a way Peter could never understand at that time, that by giving up our lives in service to others, Jesus would save us. We also know we must do the same if we seek to follow him. Only in giving up our lives in service to others will we have true life, both in this world and in the kingdom of God that is to come.
