WHILE STUDYING ENGLISH LITERATURE, I read a play by the 17th-century Puritan playwright Thomas Middleton. It ended with almost all the characters dead in an orgy of murder and self-destruction. One of the few remaining characters sums up the tragedy, declaring, "Lust (i.e. greed) and forgetfulness has been among us." the same might be said of the inhabitants of the vineyards in today's readings.

Jesus directs his parable to temple officials, but the message is just as much for us. It is easy to slip into an attitude of entitlement -- a feeling we have a right to what we have, and that we don't owe anyone anything. This is especially true when things are going well in our lives, or when we feel we've attained some status. We can forget that all is gift. Then pride, greed and resentment wait at our door, distorting our outlook and leading us to error, even to destroying those who try to point us toward justice.

Today's readings are a warning for us to remember who we are—people who have received God's gifts and are called to respond by bearing the fruit of justice. Paul's letter to the Philippians offers wisdom to help us keep our spiritual balance: Give thanks, think about what is honorable and worthy of praise, and do these things. God will help us.

October - Month of the Most Holy Rosary The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary, as the liturgical feast of **Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th.**

This feast was introduced by Pope St. Pius V in the year 1571 to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces over the Turks in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The pope attributed that victory to **Our Lady of Victory**. The "arms" of the Rosary were more powerful than cannons and the valor of the soldiers who fought at Lepanto. Those "arms" can also be powerful today to **defeat ISIS and terrorism** so that the world may have peace.

The Rosary is primarily a scriptural prayer. As we pray the decades of Hail Mary's, we meditate on the mysteries from the New Testament, the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption. As St. John Paul II said of the Rosary, his favorite prayer, "We meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart." (Lk. 2:19)

In this month of October, let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a means that we can use in order to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation. **This week we pray for the Synod of Bishops meeting in Rome to consider ways to strengthen Christian Family Life.** May each family of St. Regis join together daily to pray the holy Rosary during October. **The family that prays together stays together!**
