ST. FRANCIS, LOVER OF MOTHER EARTH AND ALL CREATURES

On July 16, 1228, he was proclaimed a saint by Pope Gregory IX. He is known as the patron saint of animals and the environment, St. Francis preached the teaching of the Catholic Church, that the world was created good and beautiful by God but suffers a need for redemption because of the primordial sin of man. He preached to man and beast the universal ability and duty of all creatures to praise God (a common theme in the Psalms) and the duty of men to protect and enjoy nature as both the stewards of God's creation and as creatures ourselves.

St. Francis reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. "Praise be You, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with colored flowers and herbs." (Pope Francis).

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time
 THE COOL DAYS of fall are upon us. It's Thanksgiving weekend, a time when we count our blessings in gratitude for all we have received. The harvest reminds us that the season of abundance will quickly turn into the season of hibernation. Today's Gospel, however, does not allow us to hibernate quite yet as we ponder the question of the rich man: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus' answer implies that keeping the Commandments is not enough. It is a good start, but it is not enough. At first glance it seems as though Jesus is a little harsh with the man, but then Jesus looks at him and loves him, as if he senses his dilemma. Jesus instructs him that he much give away all his possessions in order to follow him. Is this lesson about divesting oneself of possessions and choosing the frugal itinerant life? Jesus was saying something even more important: give away your attachment not only to possessions, but also to the stature and prestige we associate with possessions. We will never know if the rich man gave away all his possession to follow Jesus. All we can truly know is what we are willing to give up so we can be true Disciples of Christ. *Marilyn-Ann Elphick,*
