MESSAGE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON, CAROLINE PETERS

As our *Jubilee Year of Mercy* comes to a close, let us recap a few items that we have been able to accomplish in our Church.

Some of the Corporal works of Mercy are defined as to feed the hungry and give drink to the thirsty. We do this by making sure that the pantry shelf is supplied. During times when there have been house fires we donate to families and helped clothed them. Many of us are foster parents. This at times means making room in your home and daily lives for these children. Our dear Sister Christine has had to decrease the number of homes that she visits. Now we have begun the training for Pastoral Care for the sick, elderly and homebound, so this essential service can continue. We also started to reach out to the prisons for comfort and care, so when they return home they will have a place in our Church. We have installed seven youth to serve as Altar Servers during mass. A new Confessional was constructed through a generous donation from one of our recently deceased parishioner, and a plaque was displayed in his honor (May his soul rest in peace). The seventh Corporal work of Mercy is to bury the Dead. Not only do we have funeral mass in the Church, but have held yearly masses in the grave yards, and the devotion to All Saints and All Souls by reciting the Holy Rosary. Some memorable occasions include the visits to the St. Anne de Beaupre, the Holy Door in Quebec City, and the participation in the INSPIRE Summit in Lake Placid. Our Parish Council serves our Church and will continue to make available occasions such as these.
