CHRIST THE KING

SHEPERD? KING? Which is the model Jesus demonstrates? A shepherd is one who cares for the sheep, at times even offering even his own life for them. A king, on the other hand, can be remote from most people, unapproachable -- and someone whom we may even fear.

But perhaps the two images of shepherd and king are not diametrically apposed. Surely the reason the Church presents them in this same liturgy is to show us new opportunities for understanding Jesus's mission.

When we read about the life of Jesus, we see that his kingdom was not to be understood as one of power, but rather of service. Indeed, Matthew has just reminded us a few verses earlier that "the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve." This is precisely why, as disciples who seek to imitate Jesus, we embark on the path to eternal life when we give food, clothing, compassion indeed, any assistance – to others. In serving the poor, the sick and those in prison, we are serving Jesus, for it is in serving "the least of these who are members of my family" that we come to recognize Our Lord.

To enter into eternal life, we must follow the example of the shepherd king who did not hesitate to serve, heal and liberate the poorest of the poor.
